There are two types of fully licensed physicians in the U.S. – allopathic physicians (M.D.s) and osteopathic physicians (D.O.s). You can find D.O.s in all specialties from family practice to surgery. Osteopathic physicians are known for their "whole person" approach to care that helps patients achieve better health.

West Michigan OsteoScholars is an exclusive partnership between Michigan State University Extension and the Osteopathic Foundation of West Michigan.

The program brings together world-class local resources to give you learning opportunities that prepare you for college and medical school. Meetings are held just once a month and you'll be introduced to area physician mentors,

resume-building experiences, and you can even try your hand at medical procedures at the Mercy Regional Simulation Lab.

This program is the first step on a path of exclusive opportunities that may include a full scholarship to MSU's OsteoCHAMPS summer program*, a \$500 college scholarship to any college, admission support for MSU's undergraduate programs, admission to MSU's Osteopathic Medical Scholars Program, and preferential admission to MSU College of Osteopathic Medicine. The value of these experiences cannot be overstated.

There is no charge for the program, but enrollment is a privilege so full participation is expected from each student.

REQUIREMENTS

- Open to current high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- Must attend meetings once per month at Hackley Hospital in Muskegon.
- Applications due Tuesday, September 19, 2017

- 4. **LETTER OF REFERENCE**. Attach a letter of reference from a high school teacher, principal, or counselor.

The completed application may be submitted by email (PDF attachment), mail, or hand delivery. Students are expected to demonstrate their communication skills by submitting the application and attachments from their own email address. It must be received on or before **Tuesday, September 19, 2017**.
